

Use of Sports Premium Funding for 2020-2021

This year, schools have received PE and Sport Funding. This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and Sport, for the benefit of primary aged children, in the 2020-2021 academic year so that they are encouraged to develop healthy, active lifestyles. The exact amount of money that we will receive is £17,640 (based on £16,000 and £10 per pupil in years 1-6).

There was also £1, 662.85 of funding carried forward from 2019-2020 (due to lockdown). We have used this money to pay for new equipment including new basketball posts and archery sets for our Interhouse competitions.

Membership of the Vale Partnership	£450	This includes access to everything within the CPD package which includes generic CPD sessions, support from the Vale Partnership and the opportunity to attend Vale Partnership competitions. It also provides the opportunity for the school to participate in virtual competitions whilst the Covid-19 restrictions are in place. Teachers and Teaching Assistants will be able to build on their PE knowledge and confidence when teaching PE/ supporting within PE lessons through taking part in CPD sessions. We have been unable to have Danny on the school site so far due to the Covid-19 restrictions and school closure period however, we have planned in sessions for the Summer Term including Play Leader training, Archery CPD for staff and Archery sessions for the children.	Support has been available virtually for staff throughout the return to school and remote learning periods. During the Summer Terms, Years 1-6 have had an archery workshop session. Year 6 have also had a cricket session with our SScO.
Purchase of sports kit and equipment	£3,010.36	New equipment will allow children to take part in a wide range of sports, events and physical activity. It will motivate children and staff in PE lessons and extra-curricular activities. Additional equipment also bought for Interhouse competitions.	Equipment purchased includes: -Portable basketball stations -Archery sets -Tri-golf sets -Portable PA system to allow dance to be taught outside during the Covid-19 restrictions. -Football goals for use during break times, PE lessons and after school clubs -Additional equipment for use during Sports Day to avoid equipment being used across class groups. Equipment has been used in PE lessons, during active breaks and as part of continuous provision in Foundation Stage and Year 1 to further enhance the provision and to broaden the range of physical activity/ PE taking place. Buying more equipment for children to use at break times provides more opportunities for the children to be physically active during the school day. We have had positive feedback from both staff and children regarding this.
Extra swimming teacher for class swimming sessions (so that there is a swimming teacher working with each group) and cost of extra sessions in the Summer Terms for non 25m swimmers in Y4-6. Transport cost for school	£1,100	Each of the 3 swimming groups during class swimming sessions will have a qualified swimming teacher leading their session. This should hopefully result in quicker progression and development of the children's swimming skills. It will help the children to have more chance of achieving the minimum swimming requirements by the end of KS2. Children in Y4-6 who have not achieved the 25m and water safety requirements by the end of their standard provision will have the opportunity to attend extra school swimming sessions in order to help them to achieve the end of KS2 requirements. Our school swimming sessions have been limited this year due to Covid-19 restrictions along with work taking place at the pool that we use.	Weekly swimming sessions now have a qualified teacher working with each group. Year 5 attended school swimming sessions in Summer 2 Term-33% of children have met the requirements from their sessions during Summer 2 Term.
